

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### **From Ms. Samantha Forster** 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Elementary Teacher

This week's theme was pizza making! It was an amazing way to have the week after testing and before another round of testing. It felt exciting and new. Each student had their own favorite part (though they may never share it.)

In math, we continued to work on new information in each grade but focused on reviewing as well. I have wanted to keep the excitement about learning happening while still strengthening the concepts that we may need to work on still. Third grade worked on adding and subtracting large numbers as well as multiplying 2 digit numbers with 1 digit numbers. It was a great way to refresh multiplication facts without feeling repetitive. Second grade continued with their multiplication strategies as well as addition and subtraction with larger numbers. This was fun and helped students develop their own personal learning strategy with mathematical concepts.

In language arts, we focused on Benjamin Franklin this week with multiple different articles. We compared and contrasted those texts. Vocabulary has become a favorite of the students so we worked on developing complete and complex sentences with these words. We also used context clues to build understanding as they identify vocabulary words in a text.

We spent the week reading recipes, reading pizza articles, doing pizza math, and making tomato sauce. We also made the dough for our woodfired pizza event today. It was a great way to utilize our resources as well as teaching a new skill. It was so much fun. We will utilize these skills later this month when we make woodfired cookies!

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#### From Ms. Laurie Roberts

4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Elementary Teacher

Although the year is winding down, we still have more work to do in grades 4 and 5. We are calling May the "Month of Work, Sprinkled With Fun Stuff." We are continuing our routines of reading and math rotations, along with writing, science and social studies.

In math and science, we are focusing heavily on measurement. We are using both the customary and metric systems. We are also going through a lot of math vocabulary that we have used throughout the year, and making sure we remember what all of the words mean.

In reading we are reading one story a day and answering comprehension questions. In writing, we are writing a podcast, with a focus on opinion writing.
